The 2019 Conservative Manifesto committed to a £3.8bn Social Housing Decarbonisation Fund (SHDF) over a 10-year period to improve the energy performance of social rented homes in England, on the pathway to Net Zero 2050.

SHDF provides funding to local authorities, combined authorities, registered providers of social housing, and registered charities that own social housing in England to install energy efficiency upgrades and low-carbon heating measures to homes in England.



Social Homes - with a capped infill contribution for up to 30% other tenure types



Energy inefficient homes - **EPC rating of D-G**



Grants for energy efficiency measures - in Standard Assessment Procedures (SAP) - and low-carbon heating



Co-funding - requirement of at least 1:1 ratio

Wave 2.2 Funding Eligibility





Who is eligible?

- Local Authorities
- Combined Authorities
- Registered Providers of social housing including ALMOs (RPs)
- Registered Charities that own social housing

Including...

*RPs who have **never bid** for SHDF funding before.

*RPs who **previously bid** for SHDF Wave 2.1 and were **unsuccessful**.

Other criteria:

- ALMOs that are not RPs can only apply as part of a consortium led by an organisation that is eligible to lead a bid
- Organisations that were successful in Wave 2.1 may lead a consortia for Wave 2.2, providing they do not retrofit their own stock.

^{*}Can apply directly or as a consortium.



Wave 2.2 Funding Eligibility

What properties are eligible?

- All existing social housing as defined by the Housing and Regeneration Act 2008 (S68-70), below EPC C, owned by eligible applicants, regardless of archetype
- A small number of homes not meeting this definition may be funded on an infill basis
- Homes both on and off the gas grid are eligible for funding.

What properties aren't eligible?

 Homes retrofitted in a previous wave of the SHDF are not eligible.

Bid Criteria

There is no minimum bid size in terms of the amount of funding requested

Minimum number of properties?

 All Wave 2.2 proposals should include a minimum of 100 eligible social housing properties at EPC band D-G per bid

What if I have less than 100 properties?

- Applicants wishing to apply to Wave 2.2 with fewer than 100 eligible social housing properties at EPC band D-G should first look to submit a bid as part of a consortium, with this consortium bid meeting the minimum threshold.
- If neither of the above are possible despite every effort, then applicants may submit a bid with fewer than 100 homes with strong justification

The Social Housing Retrofit Accelerator (SHRA) is a government-backed service supporting SHDF bids to help social housing providers across England successfully bid for the SHDF
